

GUIDELINES FOR Homeopathy LICENSURE WITHIN DHCC

Licensure:

In addition to licensure requirements as per the "Application for Homeopathy License", each licensure applicant must meet all of the following education and training per category:

For Doctor of Medicine with the Complementary & Alternative Medicine (CAM) specialty of Homeopathy Licensure

- a) Active medical license to practice medicine in DHCC and be current in certification from DHCC for emergency medical procedures; **AND**
- b) At least 240 hours of formal training in homeopathy in a recognized homeopathic educational institution with certification of having successfully completed the course; **AND**
- c) At least 3 years full time experience practicing homeopathy; including documentation of at least 10 cases with at least 2 follow-up visits over a six month period of time; **AND**
- d) Applicants may be required to have a personal interview.

For Doctor of CAM in the specialty of Homeopathy Licensure

- a) Bachelor's degree in homeopathy from a recognized and accredited University, or a general Bachelor's degree from a recognized and accredited University; **AND**
- b) The applicant will have graduated from a recognized homeopathic training program (see list of recognized training programs and associations below). ; **AND**
- c) The institution that offers the Homeopathic education program shall be accredited as an institution of higher education by the country in which it is based; **AND**
- d) The program shall have at least 2,400 hours of formal training in homeopathy over three years in a recognized educational institution with certification of having successfully completed the course. In addition they must have successfully completed at least one course in human anatomy, one course in human physiology, and one course in pathology **AND**
- e) Documentation of at least 250 hours of clinical supervision in the practice of homeopathy; **AND**
- f) 20 supervised cases with at least 2 follow-up visits over 6 months; **AND**
- g) Any qualified person who has graduated from a recognized Homeopathic training program as outlined above must also be licensed in the countries of practice, current in certification from DHCC for emergency medical procedures (e.g. cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR)); **AND**
- h) Full-time homeopathic practice experience of at least 5 years; **AND**
- i) Applicants must have a personal interview.

For Associate Doctor of CAM in the specialty of Homeopathy Licensure

- a) Requirements "a" through "g" in Homeopathic Practitioner licensure; **AND**
- b) Applicants must have a personal interview.

Please note: After 5 years completion of full-time practice as an Associate Doctor of CAM in the specialty of Homeopathy, that may include full-time practice experience as a licensed Homeopathy Professional in another country, and with the recommendation of a Doctor of Medicine with the CAM specialty of Homeopathy or Doctor of CAM in the specialty of Homeopathy with whom they have been affiliated they may apply for a license as a Doctor of CAM in the specialty of Homeopathy.

 - h) Council for Homeopathic Certification (CHC); American Institute of Homeopathy (AIH), American Board of Homeotherapeutics (ABHT); and the Homeopathy Academy of Naturopathic Physicians (HANP) – United States

Re- License

- a) Continuous Education requirement of thirty (30) accredited hours within the last two (2) years. Of these 30 hours, 20 hours shall be in the area of homeopathy and 10 shall be in the area of general medicine.

Please note: Evidence of malpractice insurance is required before a license can be issued, make sure to provide the licensing department with a copy of your insurance policy whenever applicable.
